International Funding Opportunities for Faculty

IUPUI GRANTS

International Development Fund (IDF): The IDF grant was developed to enhance the international focus of the IUPUI academic mission. Generally, the IDF grant serves as venture capital to stimulate additional funding for international activities, which have strong potential to generate indirect cost recovery from extramural sources in the areas of research, teaching, and/or service. Grants normally range from \$1,000 to \$15,000 with the average around \$10,000. <http://research.iupui.edu>.

International Visiting Research Scholars/Professors Support Program (IVRS):

The IVRS assists IUPUI faculty departments in bringing faculty from abroad for research collaboration and instructional. The program aims to enhance internationalization of both teaching and research. Projects should also forge or strengthen collaborations with international institutions. Funds must be used to support the teaching and research activities of the visiting scholar. The campus provides up to one third of total support costs, not to exceed \$10,000 plus benefits. The sponsoring department and/or school also provides at least one third of the costs, and external grant support and/or the visiting scholar's institution provides the rest. <http://research.iupui.edu>.

International Service Learning Curriculum Development Grants (ISLCD): The ISLCD program provides grants for faculty to design an undergraduate international service learning course (integrated into a study abroad experience). It is designed to strengthen international partnerships and collaborations, and to improve student learning outcomes connected to service learning, international learning, and civic engagement. A faculty stipend \$3,000 and matching funds to cover expenses associated with planning and implementing the class are provided by the Center for Service and Learning. Faculty are also able to apply for Service Learning Assistants to aid in developing, implementing, and evaluating the course. <http://csl.iupui.edu>.

RISE to the IUPUI Challenge Curriculum Development Grants (RISE): The RISE to the IUPUI Challenge initiative engages students in their own learning by encouraging undergraduates to include at least two of the four RISE experiences – research, international, service learning and experiential learning - into their degree programs. RISE grants provide up to \$2500 in summer support to develop a new course or redesign an existing course in line with RISE criteria. These courses must be credit-bearing and must incorporate qualified experiential learning projects with integration of knowledge, reflection, and assessment. Grants to Bring Outstanding International Scholars or Distinguished International Leaders to IU: Support for IU schools and administrators to bring international scholars or individuals who have demonstrated significant leadership in international affairs to the university. Support typically covers the expenses of bringing an acclaimed visitor to IU.
Funding: Up to \$25,000 There are no established deadlines for this grant program.

IU Conference and Workshop Grants: Support for IU departments or faculty to conduct symposia, conferences, workshops, and roundtables at IU. The event should bring people together to explore international topics in new ways, to discuss vigorous new directions in international research, or to explore scientific topics with international colleagues. Funding: \$3,000 to \$12,000, depending on scope and participation Deadlines: November 1, February 1.

John W. Ryan Award: The John W. Ryan Award for Distinguished Contributions to International Programs and Studies honors Indiana University faculty members for exceptional contributions to the University's international programs and studies.
Funding: Recipients of this award will be recognized at the Founder's Day ceremony with a certificate and an award of \$1,000 to be provided by the IU Foundation. Up to two awards are given each year within the IU system. Deadline: November 21.

Language Learning Grants: Support for IU faculty to acquire new language capability necessary for carrying out a planned research activity or to enhance teaching, or engage in other university-related activities. Grants may be awarded for intensive language programs in the US or abroad, special tutorials, or regularly offered language courses. Funding: \$2,000 to \$5,000 Deadlines: Applications will be accepted when these opportunities arise.

Overseas Conference Fund Grants: Partial support for faculty to attend an international conference to present a competitively selected paper. Awards: Up to \$1200 Deadlines: October 1, January 15, April 1, July 1.

Overseas Research Grants: Support for IU faculty to explore new research projects to be conducted abroad. Funding: \$2,000 to \$5,000 Deadlines: November 1, March 1.

Overseas Study Program Development Grants: Support for faculty to explore the academic and logistical local arrangements for prospective faculty-led study abroad programs. Funding: Maximum of \$3,000 Deadline: November 1, February 2.

OVPIA International Exchange Development Grants: Support for IU campuses or schools to explore new exchange possibilities with IU's existing university-wide strategic or major exchange partners. For 2008-09, these include: Zhejiang University; Sun Yat Sen University; Peking University; Sungkyunkwan University; Seoul National University; National Autonomous University of Mexico; Universidad Autonoma del Estado de Hidalgo; Hebrew University of Jerusalem; American University of Cairo; State University - Higher School of Economics, Moscow; Warsaw University, University of Pune; Indian Institute of Science, Bangalore; National Institute of Development Administration (NIDA), Thailand; Moi University; University of Liberia; University of Witwatersrand; Free University of Berlin; Consortium of Alsatian Universities; and Universidad Complutense de Madrid. Funding: \$5,000 to \$10,000 Deadlines: November 1; February 1

Short-Term Faculty Exchange Programs: Each year OVPIA recruits faculty members and librarians for short-term (minimum of one month) assignments at a number of partner institutions abroad during the calendar year. Funding: Round-trip airfare, housing, living stipend Deadline: November 10.

Short-Term International Visitors Grants: Partial support for IU faculty to bring international faculty and specialists to IU to present lectures or performances. Funding: \$400 - \$500. Deadlines: Applications will be accepted as these opportunities arise.
