Explanation of tuition estimates

IUPUI uses a flat-rate or “banded” tuition system. This means that your tuition expenses will be the same for enrollment between 12 and 18 credits. A normal course load each semester consists of approximately 15 credits, but may be more or less depending on your individual situation. Students must take at least 15 credits each fall and spring semester in order to earn a bachelor’s degree in four years. To earn an undergraduate degree a student must usually complete at least 120 credit hours.

Enrollment in more than 18 credit hours will be charged at the per-credit rate. For 2016–2017 the undergraduate tuition rate is \$957.58 per credit hour above 18 credits. This amount is also charged for any summer enrollment, which is optional for most programs. For more information on banded tuition, see <http://www.bursar.iupui.edu/bandedtuition.asp>.

Updated 2017-2018 tuition rates will be posted over the summer. Go to <http://bursar.iupui.edu/> to check for updates. (There you will also find detailed information about mandatory fees which are charged in addition to tuition.) Tuition increases are approved annually and may range from 3-5%.

Program Fees

Programs in the **Herron School of Art, Kelley School of Business, Purdue School of Engineering & Technology, School of Nursing, Purdue School of Science, and School of Social Work** charge program fees in addition to regular tuition and mandatory fees. Please go to <http://bursar.iupui.edu/> to check the program fees for your school. These fees are only charged once you have obtained admission directly into the academic program. Most undergraduate students are admitted first into University College, not directly into their degree program.

All students with F-1 or J-1 visa paperwork issued by IUPUI will be charged an International Student Services fee during each semester of enrollment. The current amount of this fee is \$91.80 per semester.

Explanation of living expenses

The estimate for living expenses is determined as follows:

Room and Board.....	\$ 9430
Personal Expenses	\$ 2106
Transportation (cost of monthly city bus pass).....	\$ 270
Annual expenses subtotal (9 months)*.....	= \$11,806

***If you will not travel home for the summer, be sure to plan for full 12-month expenses as listed. 12 – month expenses do not include summer tuition and fees. Summer enrollment is optional.**

Actual costs will depend on your personal choices and spending habits. Housing costs will vary depending on where you live. Eating meals in restaurants will significantly increase the cost of food each month. The information above is based on the average cost of campus housing with a full meal plan.

Dependents

If you plan to bring your spouse and/or dependent children with you, you must document funding for each dependent to cover the cost of basic needs like rent, food, clothing, and health insurance:

- Spouse: \$6,920
- 1 Child: \$6,920
- 2 Children: \$13,840
- For additional children beyond 2, you will only need to show \$5,200 per child

Tuition Billing

Tuition billing is done online at IUPUI after students enroll in classes. You will not receive a paper bill in the mail. Therefore, it is essential that you set up your IUPUI email account as soon as possible. Bills can be paid online with a credit card (MasterCard, Discover or American Express) through the IU Pay system. A "convenience fee" is charged for all credit card payments. Tuition Payment Dates

The due date of your bill will depend on when you enroll in classes. You can view tuition billing and due dates on the Bursar home page at <http://bursar.iupui.edu/>.

Pay attention to the registration deadlines each semester. An academic calendar outlining deadlines for dropping and adding classes is available at <http://registrar.iupui.edu/accal.html>. Late registrants must still adhere to tuition due dates, but will also be assessed a late registration fee of \$75. *You should plan to arrive on time so that late registration is not necessary.*

Tuition Payment Installment Plans

If you register before classes start, you may use a four-payment installment plan. Details of the payment plan system are available at <https://bursar.iupui.edu/payoptions.asp#defer>.

Mandatory Health Insurance Information

All students in F or J visa status are required to enroll in IUPUI's mandatory health insurance program for international students, unless sufficient alternative health insurance is confirmed by the waiver deadline. The cost to students for the 2016–2017 academic year is \$1,720 per year, regardless of age. (Rates are expected to rise slightly for the 2017-2018 academic year.) Coverage begins from August 1 of one year and continues to July 31 of the following year. Students arriving for the Spring semester are covered from January 1. Coverage for dependents is required and is available at an additional cost. Student Account Billing

Student accounts are billed in two installments each year:
\$721 for the Fall semester coverage from August 1 through December 31 (billed in September), and
\$999 for Spring and Summer coverage from January 1 through July 31 (billed in January).

These amounts are based on the 2016-2017 rates.

Waivers

Students with pre-arranged health insurance requesting a waiver from the mandatory health insurance plan must do so by the waiver deadline. To qualify for a waiver, you must submit the waiver request form, available through the iStart system at istart.iu.edu. The waiver deadline is 10 days after the start of classes each semester. Students who do not file acceptable waiver requests with the Office of International Affairs by the deadline may be denied a waiver solely on the basis of late filing of the request.
